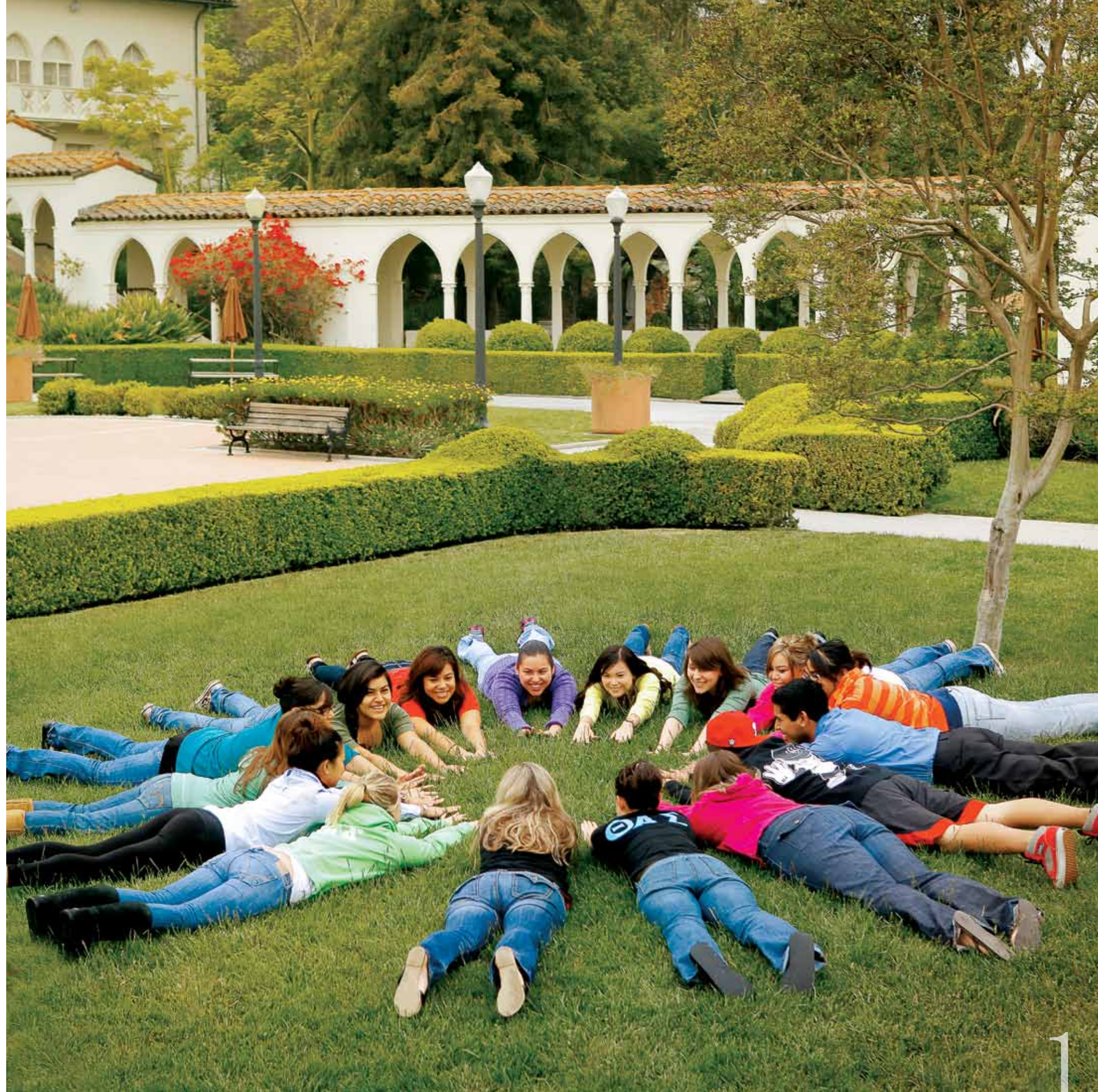

STUDENTS RESEARCH CAUSES OF CANCER These students never expected to be researching causes of cancer in college. But Dr. Eric Stemp and his students are seeking to understand free radical DNA damage, which plays a major role in both cancer and aging. “If you were a student at a larger school, you’d have to be very aggressive to get a spot in a research group. Here, research is required for your science degree...and you get to do it alongside a faculty member who will give you individual attention,” he says. Students present their research at both local and national meetings, putting them in the spotlight. “We’ve had excellent graduate and medical schools try to recruit our students from those conferences,” says Dr. Stemp. A number of Mount graduates have been hired at leading biotech companies as a result of their research.

A PROFESSOR INSPIRES LOVE OF LAW

Jane Kutepova came to the Mount with career plans to become a politician, but the “law bug” bit her. “I first got involved with the mock trial program, and Dr. Boutrous really mentored me in the process of conducting a trial. Now, I am interested in appellate law,” she says. Majoring in political science with a pre-law minor, Jane had a good head start, earning the title of “best attorney” at a regional moot court competition. The next year, she and her moot court partner advanced to the prestigious national competition, and received the sixth highest score in that bracket. Jane has also earned an impressive internship with the Los Angeles District Attorney’s Office, after some interview coaching from Dr. Boutrous. “In any other college environment, I don’t think I would have been able to get the customized guidance in the area of law that Dr. Boutrous has provided.”

The Mount Classroom

With an average of just 18 students per class, personal attention is the norm at the Mount. In small classes, you'll have the chance to participate and get hands-on experience. Many students find it empowering to study among women and become more confident in their abilities.

Our Faculty

Our faculty members are excellent teachers, with advanced degrees from top universities such as Yale, Stanford, Georgetown and Notre Dame. More important, they have a passion for teaching students. With one faculty member for every 11 students, they get to know each one as an individual, and care about her success.



Academic Advising

As a new student, you'll be assigned a faculty advisor who will help you design a program of study for your individual interests and goals. You'll

meet with your advisor frequently to discuss course selection, internships and academic progress.

Academic Support

Both campuses have Learning Centers to provide you with free, individual tutoring for academic courses. Our writing tutors are here to assist, if you need help composing your papers. We also offer individualized academic counseling to help you find ways to study more effectively.

Women's Leadership Program

For the past 85 years, the mission of Mount St. Mary's College has been to develop leaders for the future. Our popular Women's Leadership Program helps you develop valuable leadership skills through workshops, internships, conferences and more. Most Mount students are involved with the Women's Leadership program in some way, from attending Leadership Boot Camp to leading various clubs and organizations.

Public Leadership Education Network (PLEN)

Through PLEN, you'll experience firsthand how public policy is shaped and implemented at the national level. Students meet with women leaders in Washington, D.C., to learn about law, science, technology and congress, as well as international and national policy.

Student Research

Every science student is required to complete research, and our students often present their work at regional, state, and national conferences. If you're majoring in sociology, psychology or political science, you'll also have research opportunities. The Minority Access to Research Careers (MARC) program at the Mount offers financial gifts to allow minority students to pursue research.

Honors Program

The Mount offers an honors program on the Chalon campus for those who show exceptional academic ability and maintain a GPA of 3.4 or higher. Classes are very small so that you can explore ideas in depth and challenge yourself even more.

Study Abroad

Students can earn credits while studying in England, Korea, Spain, Australia, Italy and many other countries. You can take courses in your major, work on a minor or finish off your general studies requirements. Various academic departments offer opportunities to study away, such as internships in Washington D.C. and other world capitals. Special grants are available to help you pay for study abroad.

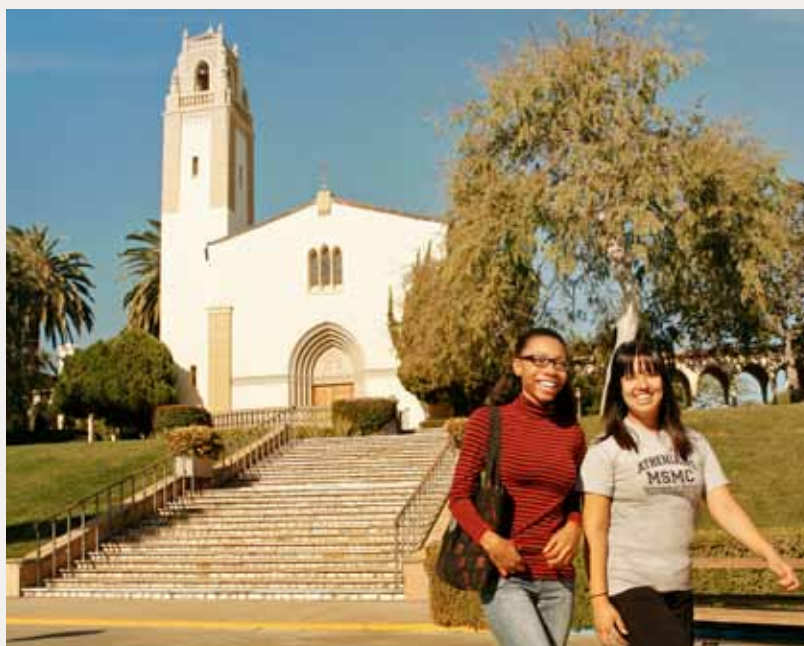

Two Unique Campuses

Mount St. Mary's College is set on two beautiful campuses in Los Angeles. Our Chalon campus sits high in the Brentwood hills overlooking Los Angeles, near the world-famous Getty Center. Home to our Bachelors programs, Chalon features striking Spanish colonial architecture and an amazing ocean view. The campus is safe and secluded, yet in the center of everything. If you were a fan of the TV shows *The OC* or *90210*, you'll recognize the Chalon campus as Harbor and West Beverly High School!

The Doheny campus lies in Los Angeles' historic West Adams District. The campus is built on a gated Victorian estate including various former mansions with expansive gardens. Our Associate, Graduate, Weekend College and educational credential programs are housed on the Doheny campus. Many students earn their Associate's degree here, and then transfer to the Chalon

campus. If you've seen *Spiderman 3* or *The Princess Diaries*, you've seen this campus, since these and many other movies were filmed there.

No car? No problem! The Mount's shuttle will transport you, free of charge. It travels between campuses every few minutes. There's also a shuttle from the Doheny campus to Union Station, and from the Chalon campus to various spots on the Westside including Third Street Promenade and UCLA.

Living on Campus

You can really focus on your studies and get more involved in student life when you live on campus. Nearly 500 students can live on the Chalon campus, in two houses and three residence halls. The Doheny campus can house 160 women, with two residence halls and two undergraduate houses.

Access to Excitement

Los Angeles is one of the most exciting cities in the world...and even if you live here, you probably haven't explored



all the places that make it great. As the world's capital of entertainment, LA also offers unique opportunities for internships and employment.

Welcome Week

The first week of classes, the Mount gives a warm welcome to freshmen and returning students with many different events such as the Student Involvement Fair, evening entertainment and much more.

Speakers Series

Many notable speakers come to the Mount to inspire, inform and entertain you, from Sr. Helen Prejean, who wrote the book-turned-movie *Dead Man Walking*, to the former mayor of Los Angeles, Richard Riordan. A variety of academic departments sponsor speakers series, including the Business Administration department and the Film and Social Justice department.

Film Screenings

The Mount's Film and Social Justice program host a variety of film festivals including the annual Human Rights Film Festival. Additionally, there's a weekly movie to kick off the weekend, known as Friday Night Flicks.

Health and Fitness

Have you ever tried karate, belly dancing or yoga? These are just a few of our Fitness Education classes for students. Both campuses have a fitness center where you can work out and take a dip in the pool afterwards. If you're more of a team player, join one of our intramural teams, such as volleyball or basketball.

Commuter Support

The Mount offers special amenities for commuters, including lounges where you can hang out, study or socialize between classes, and a kitchen where you can make yourself a quick meal. Enjoy a free breakfast every week at the Commuter Café.

HELPING AT-RISK KIDS MOVE UP

“If I can do it, so can you.” That’s what Karina Ocegüera tells high school students to motivate them to get a college education. Karina is the coordinator for Student Ambassadors. Introduced in 1991, the Student Ambassador Program is one of MSMC’s community/high school partnership programs designed to motivate thousands of students to complete high school and aspire to a college education. Student Ambassadors give students one-on-one help applying to colleges, providing advice and helping them search for scholarships. According to Karina, “Most of the students we encourage are not in the top 10% academically, because those students are helped by the high school counselors. We work with students who have the potential but are afraid to ask, or are discouraged with the process.” Majoring in sociology with an emphasis in medical sociology, Karina herself has come full circle. “A Student Ambassador helped me when I was going to San Fernando High School, and now I am helping others to get to college, too.”

Our Faith

Mass

For Catholics, the central experience of our faith is the Eucharist. We offer a Mass on campus twice per week when the College is in session, and people of all faiths are welcome to attend. Mass is also celebrated on special days like Ash Wednesday.

Christian Activities

The Christian Life Community Groups mix friendship and scripture study, led weekly by students. The Busy Person's Retreat, sponsored by the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet, allows students to go "on retreat" without leaving campus. The annual Hunger Banquet, held during Lent, gives you a greater understanding of hunger and poverty.

Serving on Campus

Volunteer service is a long-held tradition at the Mount. We make it easy to volunteer, with short- and long-term opportunities. On campus, you can get involved in a weekly activity such as making lunches for the homeless, or participate in one of our special events, such as fundraisers for local charities. One of our oldest traditions is the Halloween Haunted Campus event on the Doheny campus. Mount students decorate campus and give out thousands of pounds of donated candy to local trick-or-treaters.

Serving the Community

Mount students help out our community in many different ways, from organizing environmental clean-up projects, to conducting oral histories with the elderly, to tutoring school children.

An Invitation to Serve Day

Every year, the Mount holds a day-long Invitation to Serve Day, where students, faculty and staff come together in a day of service. We volunteer in such activities as sorting donations at the food bank, preparing lunches at a shelter and planting trees around campus.

HEADING TO THE TOP “My sisters and I defeated all odds,” says Dr. Geovanna Henao Waters. “We grew up in Los Angeles amidst chaos and gangs, attending public schools with low graduation rates...and yet, with the love and support of our parents, we attended some of the best colleges in the United States,” she says. Geovanna earned a double bachelor’s degree in psychology and English at Mount St. Mary’s College in 2003, and then went on to earn a master’s degree in psychology, and a doctorate degree in organizational psychology. Today, Geovanna is the chief of operations for an online retailer, and also provides consulting services to entrepreneurs. She says the Mount helped to shape the successful person she has become. “I was raised to be a strong woman, but the Mount gave me an environment which allowed me to flourish. I was able to shine and become a leader.”

ACHIEVING BIG THINGS “I built strong relationships with my professors at the Mount, and they always inspired me to do more,” says Francis Jacobo. In the few short years since she graduated in 2006 with a sociology degree, Francis has seen and done more than many people do in a lifetime. She has helped homeless families affected by Hurricane Katrina, earned a master’s degree in journalism at Columbia University in New York, and moved to Argentina to become a newspaper reporter. Now she is back in Los Angeles, where she is working as a case manager to help improve the lives of impoverished families through education. “The Mount is a Catholic school and they promote community service. I think that’s what drew me back to social work. I came back to my roots to give back to my community. We should all do our part to make this a better world.”

Entering a Career or Graduate School

The Mount gives you the education, the hands-on experience through internships, and the networking opportunities to help you get hired. More than 40% of Mount students find a job related to their degree, while 51% continue on to earn advanced degrees. Many of our students have gone on to the most prestigious graduate, medical and law schools in the nation, earning their Masters, J.D., Ph.D., MSW, M.D., Pharm.D., and other advanced degrees. In fact, graduates of women's colleges are twice as likely to either go to medical school or earn Ph.D. degrees than graduates from coed colleges and universities.

Internships

The Mount has a very strong internship program, with more than 55% of students performing internships in their fields. In some majors, a year-long internship is a requirement to graduate. Our Women's Internship Network helps you to make valuable connections with influential women such as city council members, doctors and executives.

Service Learning

You can apply your classroom learning and gain valuable experience through service learning. For example, a nursing student might work at community health fairs, a sociology major might work with women in a transitional house, and an English major might teach school children how to write their own stories. This hands-on experience is valuable on your résumé.

Career Planning

The Career Center will help you explore careers, find internships and ultimately get a job. You'll find out how to create a professional and polished résumé, interview like a pro and make great connections that can help you get hired. We also invite speakers from a variety of fields so you can hear about opportunities and conditions in the real working world.

Career Preparation

A tradition for over 10 years, the Etiquette Dinner gives you practice handling a lunch interview, a business meeting at a cocktail party and networking at social events. You'll not only learn which fork to use, but also how to hold a conversation and make a good impression. Held at the elegant Doheny Mansion, it's just one of the events the Mount offers to help you prepare for a career.
